

2009 Chevrolet Cup at Seafair Budweiser Logboom Rules & Regulations

1. Logboom space for the Chevrolet Cup at Seafair Unlimited Hydroplane Race and KeyBank Air Show at Seafair will be guaranteed to credentialed Logboom participants from 6:00AM Saturday, August 1, 2009 through 6:00PM Sunday, August 2, 2009.
2. **Thursday July 30:** Credentialed boats arrive by 9:00A AM and must be tied to the logboom no later than 9:30 AM on Thursday July 30. **Weekend July 31 - August 2:** Credentialed boats must arrive by 12:00 PM at the west high rise of the I-90 Bridge and be tied to the logboom no later than 12:30 PM July 31 - August 2. All boats must stay tied to the logboom until after the Blue Angels' performance each day which is scheduled to be completed by 2:30PM each day. Boat traffic is not allowed East of the logboom until after the Blue Angels' performance.
3. Credentialed boats arriving **after the Blue Angels fly** and proceeding to the white section only must enter through the west high rise. All other credentialed boats going to any other section must enter through the east high rise or the south entrance, between Bailey Peninsula and Mercer Island. All boats leaving the white section must leave the area through the west high rise only at a no wake speed; no transit are allowed through the north end of the course. All others may leave via the east high rise or the south end at a no wake speed.
4. All applications must be accompanied by a photo of the vessel showing WN numbers and certified name unless registered on the boom in the last 3 years.
5. With the exception of licensed charter boats, Coast Guard regulations prohibit boat owners from charging their guests a fee for use of their boat.
6. No rafting of non-paying vessels will be allowed, except in the broadside section where registered boats will be allowed to raft one shuttle boat. Seafair will install a barrier to keep non-registered boats away from the logboom.
7. One shuttle boat is allowed for each tied broadside boat to transport people to and from shore (Maximum 28 feet). Exit/entry in the morning is restricted to the west high rise only. No east/west travel will be allowed until after the Blue Angels' performance. One additional shuttle boat pass (Maximum 24 feet) is available for an additional fee of \$500 for tied broadside vessels only.
8. SWIMMERS MUST BE OUT OF THE WATER WHEN THE RACE BOATS ARE ON THE COURSE. NO DIVING FROM BOATS. INFLATABLE DEVICES MUST BE SMALLER THAN 3 FEET AND HOLD NO MORE THAN ONE PERSON. NO TRAMPOLINES OR ISLANDS. SEAFAIR CAN REVOKE YOUR OPPORTUNITY TO USE ANY FLOATATION DEVICES.
9. Absolutely no water balloon launchers, water guns, or cannons will be allowed. Boaters caught launching water balloons will have their credentials revoked and will be removed from the logboom.
10. Upon arrival, stern tie vessels will tie directly next to the beam of existing tied vessels. Broadside will make best bow to stern moorage. Spots in any section except the Blue Section may not be reserved.
11. Skippers of all boats on the logboom are responsible for the conduct of their guests at all times.
12. Skippers of any boats on the logboom will have their credentials revoked for any lewd or illegal conduct, thus will be removed from the logboom.

13. Vessels on the logboom must be manned at all times with a person capable of operating the vessel.
14. Only motorized boats, except for WN registered sailboats, will be accepted. All boats must have manufactured hulls. No rafts or inflatable devices are allowed.
15. Seafair Boat Patrol, with the support of the U.S. Coast Guard, Seattle Harbor Patrol, and King County Marine Patrol, are authorized to revoke credentials and remove non-complying boats from the logboom.
16. No commercial banners are permitted on participating boats without written authorization from Seafair.
17. In rare instances, an individual section of the logboom may be oversold because spectator boats are larger than registered or not moored closely together. In these instances, Seafair reserves the right to move spectator boats to sections of the logboom other than originally requested by the spectator. Seafair recommends that spectator boats arrive early in the day to avoid this inconvenience.
18. Absolutely no radio broadcast or use of a radar is allowed from the logboom without written pre-authorization from Seafair. Boats violating this rule will be removed from the logboom immediately.
19. In the event of high wind conditions (in excess of 10-15 knots), at Seafair's discretion, some broadside tied boats may be asked to rotate to a stern tie position.
20. Due to FAA regulations no kites or helium balloons will be allowed.
21. Refund Policy: Full refunds will be given to those participants who request the refund in writing prior to July 1st. 50% will be refunded between July 2 and July 16. No refunds will be made after July 16, 2009.

In consideration and acceptance of logboom space at the Chevrolet Cup at Seafair and the KeyBank Air Show at Seafair, I hereby waive and release any and all rights and claims I may have against the following entities (including their employees, officers, agents, Boards and volunteers); Seafair, Seafair sponsors, the City of Seattle, General Motors, KeyBank, Budweiser, APBA, Novastar Development, Inc., and the American Boat Racing Association, for any and all damages or injuries suffered by me or my property or suffered by any person on my boat during my participation in this Seafair event, which are as a result of the acts of Seafair, any of the aforesaid organizations, or the acts of any persons on any other boat at or in the vicinity of logboom.

I understand and agree that my participation in the logboom is purely voluntary and that there are certain risks inherent in any boating scenario. I accept those risks for myself and for all persons who are on my boat.

I understand that I am responsible for the safety and conduct of all those aboard my boat and how my passengers affect those tied up alongside by boat. I will review all rules and regulations with my passengers on my boat prior to arriving at the logboom. I understand that violators of logboom rules and regulations will be restricted from future logboom use and may, at the sole discretion of Seafair, be asked to immediately leave the logboom.

I further agree to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless Seafair and its sponsors and volunteers, the City of Seattle, General Motors, KeyBank, Budweiser, APBA, Novastar Development, Inc., and the American Boat Racing Association from and against any and all claims which might be asserted against any of them for the acts of any persons on my boat or for any damage or harm caused by myself or my boat.

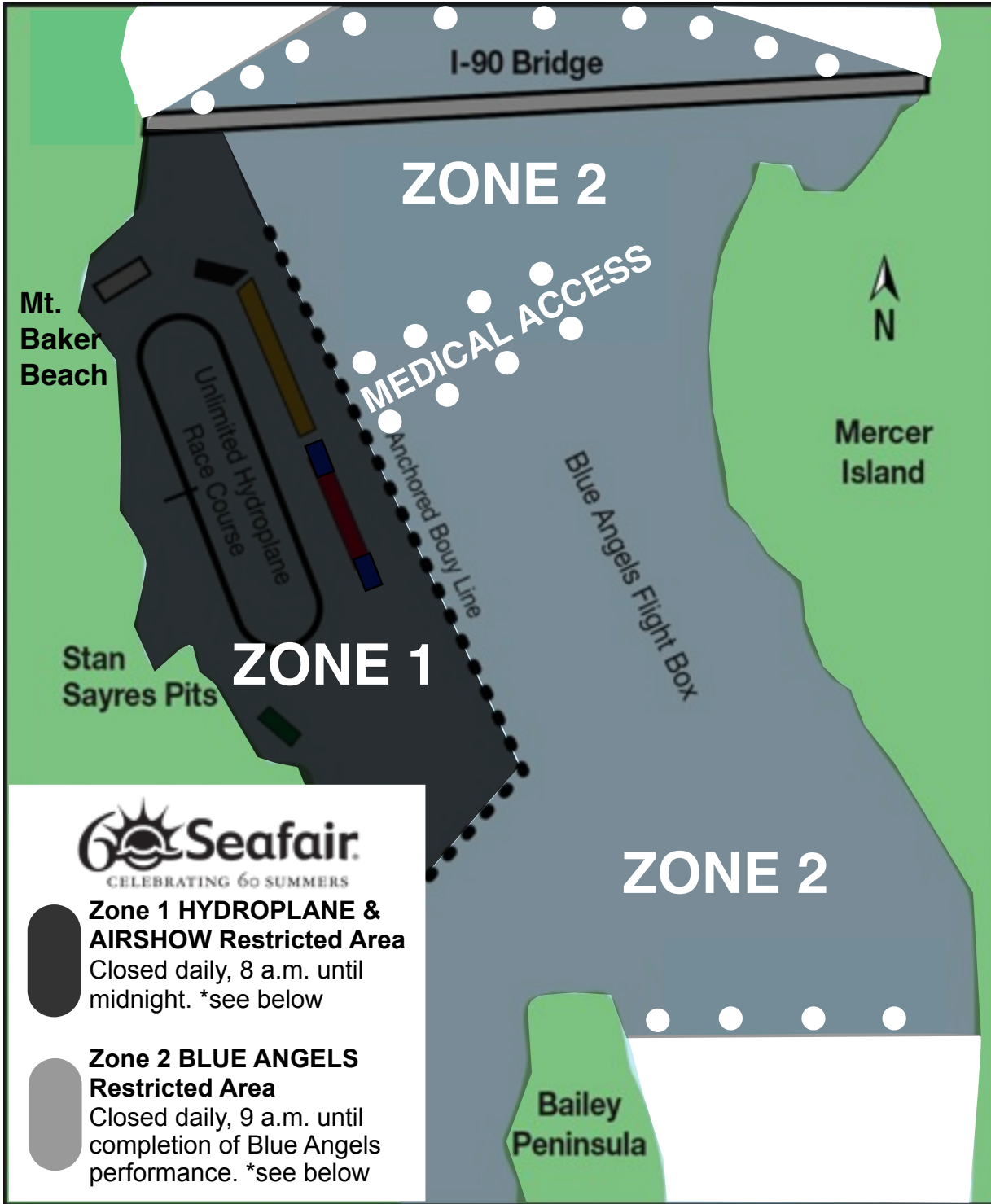

LOGBOOM PASSES:

Logboom passes are not required on Thursday or Friday.

Should the Logboom become full, all vessels without a space on the Logboom must exit the Zone 1 and Zone 2 no later than 9:45 a.m. on Thursday, and by 12:30 p.m. on all remaining days.

The logboom is reserved for customers with passes from 6:00AM Saturday to 6:00PM Sunday.

CHEVROLET CUP AT SEFAIR AND KEYBANK AIRSHOW AT SEFAIR PRESENTED BY BOEING

During July 30- August 2, 2009, Lake Washington will play host to U.S. Navy Blue Angels, hydroplane races, and aerial performances. Special restrictions and local regulations have been established in order to promote the safety of these events for both performers and spectators. These restriction and local regulations will be enforced by federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies. Failure to comply with these provisions may result in expulsion from the regulated areas, citation for failure to comply, or both. The Budweiser Logboom at Seafair is reserved for paying customers from 6:00am Saturday, August 1, 2009 through 6:00pm Sunday, August 2, 2009

SPECIAL LOCAL REGULATIONS

These rules are in effect during Seafair, and apply to Logboom vessels in Zone 1 and all vessels in Zone 2.

- Boaters proceeding to the Logboom in Zone 1 or to any area in Zone 2 shall do so only at minimum wake speed, with a maximum speed of 7 m.p.h.
- Any person swimming or otherwise entering the water in Zone 1 shall remain within 10 feet of the Logboom. No swimming is allowed on the racecourse side of the Logboom when hydroplane boats are on the race course.
- Any person swimming or otherwise entering the water in Zone 2 shall remain within 10 feet of their vessel.
- Vessels on the Logboom in Zone 1 may group or raft up to 3 vessels total per Logboom mooring.
- Vessels in Zone 2 may group or raft up to 6 vessels.
- Only vessels authorized by the Coast Guard Patrol Commander are authorized to tow other vessels, including inflatable and other non machinery powered watercraft.
- In order to maintain an expeditious evacuation route for official vessels, non official vessels shall avoid transiting the Medical Chute. Vessels desiring to transit the Medical Chute shall only do so at right angles, and only when the chute is not being used for official purposes.

RECREATIONAL BOATING SAFETY

- Children 12 years and younger are required to wear U.S. Coast Guard approved life jackets on vessels shorter than 19 feet whenever the vessel is underway, and on larger vessels when on an open deck or open cockpit and underway.
- When not required to be worn, PFDs must be readily accessible for every person aboard.
- **Don't Drink and Drive.** The maximum allowable Blood Alcohol Content is less than .08%. Where no capable operator is found aboard a vessel subject to a Boating While Intoxicated citation, the operator and passengers will be removed from the vessel and the vessel will be impounded.
